Organization	Project	Project Summary
Emergence	Housing for Early Recovery Support (HERS)	Supports individuals with substance use or co-occurring disorders and housing instability by providing direct assistance to overcome housing and transportation barriers.
Equitable Social Solutions Inc	Brooklyn Shankle Shelter	Emergency shelter for vulnerable adults that offers intensive case management, financial literacy, transportation support, and education on housing and tenant rights to help individuals achieve long-term housing stability.
Homes for Good Housing Agency	Permanent Supportive Housing Expansion - Bridges on Broadway	Support for programming addressing chronic homelessness for individuals with mental illness or substance use disorders. Prioritizes stable housing and provides support services to help residents maintain housing, and emphasizes collaboration with local health and behavioral services.
Housing Our Veterans Inc	Housing Our Veterans: Lane County Justice System Involved Re-entry Housing	Comprehensive re-entry housing program in Lane County for justice-involved veterans and marginalized individuals, focusing on reducing recidivism (reoffending) and aiding reintegration into society via services like stable housing, employment assistance, mental health support, and substance use disorder treatment.

Lane County	Rural Street Outreach and Senior Housing Pilot Projects	<p>The Lane County Rural Street Outreach project helps individuals experiencing homelessness in rural areas, reducing reliance on crisis systems like jails and hospitals by providing trauma-informed care and building community connections.</p> <p>The Senior Housing Pilot focuses on helping seniors (60+) facing homelessness to improve health outcomes and transition seniors into permanent housing.</p>
Mainstream Housing Incorporated	Village Fields – Emergency Shelter Operations	Emergency shelter offering safe housing for unhoused individuals, including those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).
Restored Connections Peer Center	Restored Connection Peer Center - Housing Supports Expansion	Increase capacity for peer-operated recovery services in Eugene with a focus on helping individuals in recovery, offering housing support, life skills, and a nonjudgmental environment. Provides personalized support for underserved populations, including those with mental health issues, disabilities, and veterans.
ShelterCare	Zero Income Program	Supports individuals exiting homelessness and living at or below the federal poverty line, providing essential home goods like beds, mattresses and the necessary items to maintain a clean and healthy living environment in order to help participants transition into housing with dignity.
South Lane Mental Health Services, Inc.	Vehicles for Case Management and ACT	<p>Help clients overcome transportation barriers and allow staff to meet clients in the community, assist with medical equipment, and provide group outings.</p> <p>Organization is located in Cottage Grove and serves rural and low-income populations with mental health services.</p>
